The Trust Sequence IX: Ethics & Risk Management in Complex Clinical Conundrums
For this newest workshop, The Trust Risk Management Program reviewed data from 70,000 consultations provided to date in order to determine which issues and questions are most pressing for today's psychologists. Topics will include boundaries and multiple relationships, challenging terminations, working with children in the midst of family conflict, coping with disciplinary complaints, and psychotherapy patient requests for legally-related documentation.

- 2. Evaluate potential risks when working with children in high conflict families.*
- 3. Identify high risk boundary violations and multiple relationship situations.*

- 5. Recall important considerations when making therapeutic termination decisions.*
- 6. Identify issues and strategies when psychotherapy patients make quasi-forensic requests.*

Amanda D. Zelechowski, Ph.D., J.D., ABPP is a licensed clinical and forensic psychologist and attorney. Dr. Zelechowski received her B.A. from the University of Notre Dame, her M.S. and Ph.D. from Drexel University, and her J.D. from Villanova University School of Law. She completed a postdoctoral fellowship at The Trauma Center at Justice Resource Institute (Brookline, MA) and is board-certified in Clinical Child and Adolescent Psychology. She has worked clinically with adults, children, and families in inpatient, outpatient, and forensic settings. Dr. Zelechowski is currently an Associate Professor of Psychology at Valparaiso University and teaches a wide variety of courses, including ethics and professional development in psychology, and provides clinical supervision to graduate students. Her primary research interests include trauma in forensic contexts, the assessment of at-risk, delinquent, and traumatized youth and families, and best practices in teaching and training in the areas of psychology, law, and trauma. In addition, Dr. Zelechowski is a Risk Management Consultant for The Trust, providing training and consultation to psychologists on a variety of legal and ethical

issues.
