**Scholarship options are available (deadline to submit is January 8, 2020)*

- Scholarships covering the tuition for one course of study in the Fundamentals School will be awarded to applicants employed by a town or municipality water or sewer district serving fewer than 3,300 residents within the Rocky Mountain Region. (CO, NM, WY) Scholarships will be reviewed and awarded based on size of community served, location, and level of certification required for that entity by the scholarship review board.

The Rocky Mountain Water and Wastewater Fundamentals School is a basic, comprehensive overview for water and wastewater operators. The course is divided into two separate classes, one on water and one on wastewater. The course is designed for people who are new to the field or have been in it for only a few years. It should be beneficial to those seeking Class "C", "D", "T", and "S" certification.

The goal of the Fundamentals school is to provide education for operators, so they possess a better understanding of the water and wastewater fields. The courses are designed to furnish operators with basic concepts of how treatment processes work and the requirements of government regulations. The Fundamentals school curriculum also provides opportunities to prepare for either the water or wastewater certification exams. However, operators should not use the courses as their only study guide for certification exams.

*** By taking this course, you will meet the APPROVED REGULATORY REQUIREMENT for Colorado ***

"A" and "B" operators are encouraged to participate in the Intermediate and Advanced School in April, which offers courses geared for experienced treatment plant operators.

The RMWEA Lab Practices Committee, along with Rocky Mountain Water Quality Analysts Association (RMWQAA), is excited to offer a comprehensive Quality Assurance/Quality Control (QA/QC) training October 16 and 17.

The QA/QC in Environmental Laboratories class is presented by Alloway, a full-service environmental laboratory with 37 years' experience in water and wastewater. Speakers will be Marcy Bolek, co-owner and President, and Amy Staley, Senior Analyst/ Project manager.

This is a two-day training that can also be divided into one day trainings. Day 1 (Oct 16) is a basic QA/QC course covering QA/QC basics and emphasizing practical topics that operators and analysts require most. Day 2 (Oct 17) is an advanced QA/QC class for those that have previously mastered the basics or have taken the Day 1 training. This course covers in-depth QA/QC issues including sample handling, document control, precision and accuracy, MDLs, calibration, training, ethics, corrective actions, and more.

The trainings will be at Metro Wastewater Reclamation District, 6450 York in Denver. Registration will open soon on the RMWEA Lab Practices Committee website.
